

Graduation Rate Survey – Student Right-to-Know Disclosure

In accordance with the Higher Education Act of 1965, and the Higher Education opportunity Act of 2008, Prince George’s College is reporting the graduation and transfer rates of student who enter the College in Fall 2012 as first-time, full-time, degree- or –certificate seeking student. These graduation and transfer rates are computed based on the student’s status three years after entry.

The data reflect that of the 1,017 student who entered as first-time, full-time, degree- or –certificate-seeking student in Fall 2012, 9% had graduated and 24% had transferred to a baccalaureate postsecondary institution within three years, making the Prince George’s Community College combined Graduation / Transfer rate 33% for the 2012 entering student cohort. The average graduation rate for PGCC for the last four years is 7% and the average transfer rate for the last four years is 24%.
